Then they meet someone who truly needs their help, and they must decide whether they are each willing to expose their own secrets to help—or if remaining invisible is the only way to survive middle school"

### **Ask Questions and Make Connections**

Pause to ask questions as you read the book. Make connections to your life, other books, and the world around you.

#### Before

- The title of this book is Invisible. What do you think it will be about?
- Look at the front cover of the book. What are your observations of the characters based on the artwork?

#### During

- The kids in this story are lumped together because of adult assumptions about who they are. Has this ever happened to you? How did that make you feel?
- What do you think are the benefits of being bilingual?
- The kids take food from the cafeteria and give it to Lisa and her mom. Most of the food was leftovers or was going to be thrown away. Do you consider what they did stealina?

#### After

 What can you do to make sure you see people in your life so no one feels Invisible?

Create a Service Project

In Invisible, the students meet a family struggling with food insecurity and homelessness.

Brainstorm ways you and your peers could address these issues in your community.
